TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Precision Planning, Inc. has had the opportunity to work with John D. Stephens, Inc. on several occasions in the recent past on such projects as the Upper Yellow River Interceptor Project for the Gwinnett County Water Pollution Control Department.

The Upper Yellow River Interceptor Project was a very complex project. The work consisted of installation of approximately 50,000 linear feet of interceptor sewer ranging in pipe size from 42-inch diameter to 12-inch diameter pipe. The pipe materials varied throughout the project from concrete cylinder wall pipe to ductile iron pipe and vitrified clay pipe. The work included multiple road and highway crossings, an unusual number of river crossings, and numerous utility crossings, including Seaboard System Railroad, Plantation Pipeline Company, AT&T and major Georgia Power easements.

Another such project was the Crooked Creek Outfall Project for Gwinnett County Public Utilities. This project consisted of 5,000 feet of 60-inch prestressed cylinder wall pipe constructed through a marsh/wetland environment.

John D. Stephens, Inc. has performed quality work under the most extreme conditions; one of these conditions being the unique time constraints placed on the work, and the other being the severe working conditions, especially the terrain and the limited construction easement area provided. As the General Contractor, John D. Stephens, Inc. has remained within budget and will accomplish a timely completion.
